

## Directions to Trindle Spring Lutheran Church

### From the Pennsylvania Turnpike (I-76)

- Exit PA Turnpike (I-76) at Exit 17 (exit 236) Gettysburg Pike
- After the tollbooths bear right following the sign to Route 15 - Gettysburg
- Almost immediately exit Route 15 at Cumberland Parkway / Winding Hill Rd [0.3 mi]
- At second traffic light turn right onto E. Market Street (114W) [1.0 mi]
- At first traffic light turn left onto W. Simpson St [1.6 mi]
- At second traffic light turn left onto Trindle Rd (641W) [0.5 mi]
- At second intersection (no traffic light) turn right onto State Rd (Be careful! Across street from State Rd is Sinclair Road) [0.5 mi]
- The Church parking lot is just down the road [0.1 mi]

### From Harrisburg

- Traveling on Interstate 83 south follow signs for 581 West (Exit 41A - Camp Hill / Gettysburg)
- Exit 581 W at Exit 4 [3.4 mi]
- Bear right at the bottom of the ramp
- Almost immediately turn right (at the stop sign) onto 641W (Trindle Road)
- Travel on 641W through nine traffic lights (the last one is Simpson) and turn right at second intersection (no traffic light) onto State Road (Be careful! Across from State Road is Sinclair Road) [4.6 mi]
- The church parking lot is just down the road [0.1 mi]

### From Interstate 81

- Exit Interstate 81 at Exit 57 - Mechanicsburg
- Follow signs onto 114E
- At the seventh traffic light (if you were traveling south on I-81; the fifth traffic light if you were traveling north on I-81) turn right onto 641W (Trindle Road) [-4.9 mi]
- After going through one traffic light (Simpson) turn right at the second intersection (no traffic light) onto State Rd (Be careful! Across street from State Rd is Sinclair Road) [0.9 mi]
- The church parking lot is just down the road [0.1 mi]

### From Carlisle

- Depart the city traveling west on High Street (Route 74) which becomes Trindle Road (641W)
- Travel on 641W (Trindle Road) and turn left onto State Road (No traffic light at this intersection; Be careful! Across from State Road is Sinclair Road.) [-7.2 mi]

## OUR SPEAKERS:



**THE REV. PAMELA COOPER-WHITE** is Ben G. and Nancye Clapp Gautier Professor of Pastoral Theology, Care and Counseling at Columbia Theological Seminary, Decatur, GA, and Co-Director of the Atlanta Theological Association's Th.D. program in Pastoral Counseling. In 2005, she received the American Association of Pastoral

Counselors' national award for "Distinguished Achievement in Research and Writing." She holds Ph.D.s from Harvard University and the Institute for Clinical Social Work, Chicago, and is the author of *Braided Selves: Collected Essays on Multiplicity, God, and Persons* (forthcoming 2011), *Many Voices: Pastoral Psychotherapy and Theology in Relational Perspective* (2007), *Shared Wisdom: Use of the Self in Pastoral Care and Counseling* (2004), and *The Cry of Tamar: Violence Against Women and the Church's Response* (1995; 2<sup>nd</sup> ed. forthcoming 2012). An Episcopal priest and pastoral psychotherapist, Dr. Cooper-White is a clinical Fellow in the American Association of Pastoral Counselors. A leader in abuse prevention for 30 years, she has consulted on over 100 cases of abuse in the church, served as an expert witness, led boundary workshops for synods, dioceses and presbyteries, and served as a plenary speaker for national ELCA leadership trainings. She co-authored the sexual ethics/harassment policies of the Diocese of California and the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Philadelphia, and served on the Sexual Misconduct Response Team of Columbia Theological Seminary as well as the SMRT policy revision task force of its Board of Directors. From 2002-2005 she served as the Theologian for the professional ethics (Title IV) Canon Revision Task Force of the national Episcopal Church.

**THE REV. AMY REUMANN** is the ELCA State Public Policy Office Director for Pennsylvania. She holds a B.A. from Muhlenberg College with a major in Religion and International Affairs. After serving in the Lutheran Volunteer Corps and the Lutheran Office for World Community at the United Nations, she received a Master of Divinity from the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago and a Master of Sacred Theology in Spiritual Direction from the Institute for Christian Spirituality, General Theological Seminary in New York City. She has served as a parish pastor in New Jersey and Wisconsin and as Assistant to the Bishop/Urban Coalition Director in the Greater Milwaukee Synod. She serves on the boards of Family Promise – Harrisburg Capitol Region and Pennsylvania Interfaith Power and Light.

Rev. Reumann works with the LAMPa Policy Council, synods and Lutheran agencies and institutions in Pennsylvania to identify, shape and act on policy issues that impact Pennsylvania and are consistent with the theological and public policy commitments of the ELCA, especially those commitments that relate to people without economic or political power. She is passionate about educating and equipping Lutherans to witness to their faith through becoming involved in advocacy ministry.
