5. Under what circumstances do you do pastoral visiting? Crisis-visiting?
6. Describe your comfort and interest in digital ministry.
7. Describe how Christian education fits into your ministry.
8. What Christian education resources and curriculums do you prefer?
9. How have you involved young people in worship?
10. How do you preach and lead in a politically divided country?
11. What are your expectations of the Congregation Council? How do you see your role in relationship to the Congregation Council?
12. How do you shepherd people to be disciples of Jesus Christ?
13. What forms of outreach and evangelism have you engaged in?
14. How would you help us to be and feel equipped to share our faith?
